 conjunct person, are affectable by way of Deed or at the Instance of the  
 creditors of such Debtor 995. A Bankrupt cannot in the purchase  
 of the more timely diligence commenced by one creditor to affect his  
 estate or price thereof, satisfy another by voluntary payment or Right in  
 the Estate 996. 997. 998. nor can he impede a Trustee in so 999. 1000.  
 His collusion with one creditor to give him the first of diligence before another  
 is also restrained 1000. Fraudulent cannot satisfy bona fide  
 = lable Rights granted by a person in trust to one of his creditors to the prejudice  
 of another's current diligence 998. 999. As they may acquire Rights to  
 Movable 999. Reduction upon the Act of Parliament 1621 against Bankrupts  
 is not excluded by a separate Right in the person of the Debtor 999.  
 But it is relevant to prove either that the Debtor had a sufficient Estate  
 aliunde or to offer to pay the purchase 998. 999. If a creditor has Action to  
 recover what is voluntarily paid by his Bankrupt Debtor to another creditor  
 to the prejudice of the former's diligence 1000. 1001. what is to be returned in  
 the Event of Reduction of a Right to the prejudice of creditors 1001.
