

Chap. 5.
Of Witchcraft.

The Being of Witches, and even the Possibility of
Witchcraft is called in question by many who do not
to lay any great stress upon things which to our fore
fathers appeared most convincing, tho' I cannot account

-plor. However I ~~cannot~~ think it worth to make an ob
-servation of things relating to that Matter taken from the Pro
-ceedings and Decisions of the former court of Justiciary, or
-trials of Witches in other Countries, and the observations
of Writers upon that subject, to send to the Reader
pieces of Entertainment about the former practice, tho'
it should not happen in every Respect to be observed
a Rule in this learned and Inquisitive Age, when
-bly things will come to be more accurately sifted, than
-some are ready to imagine as done; by our predecessors
as if they, following the Rumour of the time in which
-hood, had been too credulous in this important
-some things by me Related about the Marks and
-rations held of a Witch, or of a person being Convinced
-low Witches enter into Compact with the Devil, by
-having Carnal Copulation with them, White Witches
and the Imps of Witches, (to which regard had
-had in former trials, and in our practice) may be
-appro

Appear very strange; but I shall these before or false, I
-not say; only this one thing is true, that such Matters of
-fact have been laid for Judgment, and given in Evidence,
-which is all my business with them; and if any man upon
-Reading what I say of witchcraft, be of opinion, that I am
-in Error my self, I shall be so likewise.

The Devils having ever since they fell from their Glori
-ous primitive state; approved themselves to be displeas'd
-Enemies to Mankind, which the Names of Satan and Diabolus
-given their prince in the sacred Canon clearly import and
-set forth, one of the Methods taken by these cursed Be
-ings to Effect their Malicious Designs, is their tem
-pting men and women to use the black art called Super
-stitions and Demonical Magick or Witchcraft.

Authors are not well agreed who were the first practis
-ers of this Mysterious Rite; some hold up that the Antient
-Greeks were instructed in the Black art by the Devil, Silvio
-Liguisti. Magic. lib. 1. cap. 2. Sir Walter Raleigh from Symonds
and Casparius fixeth the original of it in ~~the~~ the son of
-Noah. Others again will not allow any of that wicked gang
-to have been in the world before Moses time, tho' there are
-who ascribe the Invention of Diabolical Magick to Zoro
-aster who Laughed at his Birth, Plin. Natur. Hist. lib. 30
-cap. 1. Augustin. 20 Civil. Dei lib. 21 cap. 14 and I find to
-have said as he writes by him from Heavens, Caspar
-Longus. Primus Magicum profero, but because we
-have no tolerable certainty of the person who first
-Entered upon Enquiry into this infernal Mystery, I shall
-Content my self to observe (without looking farther
-back) that there were Magicians in the world since in
-the time of Pharaoh the Great Oppressor of the Israel
-ites, before whom such Confessors with the Devil pre
-tended the Miracles of Moses and Aaron, Edd. caps. 7. the

-who aiming too high in the Fraternal knowledge
-of things Apply themselves for gratifying their
-curious
