

Committing the treason of Merton, or the time of Citation in

that his posterity may never have place nor be able to
after to Branch and Enjoy any Lands or estate honour or
Dignity within the Realm; and to have forfeited
all and every his lands & tenements
tackes & Holdings, Rooms, professional goods and gear
sover to the King proportionately with his Highness In-
property. And some time the surname of the traitor
family has been abolished. But the ordinary sentence
against one convicted of high treason is to be hanged
while he be dead, or (if a nobleman) to have his head
striek from his body and his Name & Name and
memory to be extinct, his Blood to be tainted, his
Arms to be blazoned & abhorred out of the Books
of Arms, so that his posterity may never enjoy any
honour office title or Dignity within this Realm
time coming, and to have forfeited his lands & tenem-
