 the person not being the sole furnisher of Druggs, the
 Delay is not Relevant. It was Requested for the punishment
 19th June 1700 shall be fitting whether by good or evil doing
 What may be good for one Disease may be poison for
 another: and whatever Distress and over power the
 Nature of Man, it deserves punishment. Nor can any Inconveni-
 ency from the preparation of punishing the person, will
 be to Physicians and Apothecaries, unless they will
 not being Employed by the party, give an account of
 with a Design to kill, as he did. 2^d It Misd. To be proved
 that the party did of such Druggs: for one who got to be
 poison might have died of some other Disease. But it
 sufficient to prove, that the Druggs was furnished with
 a Design to kill, and Law presumes contrivance in it
 - this: especially considering, that killing by Druggs is
 Misdemeanor and left Discoverable then by ordinary Justice
 But thereafter so far by 1677 this person having after
 time by Months for punishment, and Misdemeanor of his wife
 for his trial abandoned all his Defense was ban-
 shed, upon his own Application and consent to take that
 punishment upon him. The guilt of a Love potion to a
 Woman who died by the Drinking thereof is punishable
 with death l. 38 s. 5. § de penis. But where a Woman
 dies thro' the taking a potion to make her conceive
 with Child, the person who administered the potion who
 it had be only to an arbitrary punishment l. 35 s. 2
 § de Penal. de homic. The Reason of the Difference is, be-
 cause it is now Unlawful to go about to make a
 Woman drink in affection for a Man against her In-
 clination; than to use Means to cause her conceive.

One who Intentionally inflicts a wound that proves
 deadly

deadly, is guilty of Murder, tho' he had no Mind to kill *per se*.

 n. 17. 618. Because he who Intentionally commits Murder
 Unlawful he is an offender for all the Natural Consequences
 and thereof l. 6 f. ad. l. de vi pub. l. 1 s. 2 § de Jure.
 Rom. Instit. l. 38 s. 5. § de penis. Nichil enim Interest
 Cædant quis an Casum Mortis prædial l. 13 f. ad. l.
 f. omol. de homic. And wounds are not Justified by Misdemeanor
 Solus est therefore fully charged upon him who doth
 an Unlawful act who by one it kills, tho' he had no
 thought to offend in so high a degree. Which is agreeable
 to the Divine Law Gen. 9. 6. Exod. 21. 12 Num. l. 35. 16. 17.

It is too frequent a practice in this wicked age for the
 men to labour to cover their Crimes of fornication or
 adultery by Murdering their New born Infants. About
 some parents are so blinded by some little Sparrow
 affection from flying so broadly in the face of Nature, as
 put with their own hands their Children to a violent death
 that at the same time they show themselves most Unnatural
 their brutes, in exposing and Neglecting their best
 Infants. The Doctors are much divided about Punish-
 ing the punishment of these Misdemeanors parents. But
 the Matter may be cleared thus. If an Infant be exposed
 and left in a Desert or Unfrequented place that it may
 die for Hunger, and it dies, the exposure is punishable with
 death, *Carpro v. Crim. part. l. 1. c. 1. s. 1. de homic. et infan.*
 Mortis prædial. Unius accidit. Thus a woman having
 Exposed her Child of a haul 14 days old in the street
 of a bras in the open fields covered with of Colchob, &
 as it might not be seen to those accidentally going by,
 and left it there without the view of the army of any
 Inhabitants, who it died of hunger and Cold, was found
 to infer the pain of death, and Confession of Misdemeanor
