 edral. And where his Diocese is large hath in some remote
 Corner thereof a Commissary, whose Authority is limi-
 ted by the Bishop's Commission to a certain place and
 some particular Causes. So that in England, such a Chancellor
 is the Bishop's Universal Commissary, and a Commissary
 is one to whom the Bishop gives Ecclesiastical Jurisdic-
 tion in parts of the Diocese so remote from his Cathedral,
 that the Chancellor cannot call the Inhabitants thereof
 to the Bishop's Principal Consistory without their consent.
