To have his Remedy against - Abjuration - In Estate of Sufferance, when one comes on an Estate or Entors by a lawful lease, and keeps possession after his lease is expired, and so holds over by wrong; as a Tenant for term of years holding over his term &c.

A Responso - A writ whereby a cause formerly removed from the Ecclesiastical Court or Court Christian to the Kings Court is returned thither again is called a Responso: because the Judges of the Kings Court do upon consulting find the parties suggestion false or not proved, and therefore the cause to be wrongfully called from the Court Christian: The Court Gave Judgment that a consultation should go. A consultation is of the Nature of a procedendo, but properly a consultation sought not to be Granted, but in case where a Man cannot Recover at the Common Law in the Kings Courts.

A procedendo is to send down a Cause called from an Inferior to a Superior Court, as the Chancery, Kings Bench or Common Pleas, by writ of prohibi-logs, Certiorari, Habeas Corpus &c. to proceed upon it; it not appearing to the High Court that the suggestion is sufficiently proved. This is a procedendo in loquela. which differs from a procedendo ad Judicium, where the Judges of any Court delay the party plaintiff or defendant, and will not give Judgment for him when they ought

Retroactive Effect, by which a Thing which happens after another is to be considered in such manner as to give it the same Effect; as if the last Thing had happened at the same Time with the first - Deferrance or Reservation, which the commonly confounded with a Remainder, yet properly differs from it: In that a Remainder may be to any Man, but he who makes the conveyance for term of Life or years, whereas a Reservation is in Favour of the conveyance, and commonly perpetual, a Right expectant.

Chafe in Action, an Estate vests in conveyance - To claim under another, to sue in a higher Court - A paper of causes set down to be heard on a certain Day
