Tradition or giving of Seisin - Seisin (prescript of)

Liberty of Seisin, or Liberty and Seisin - which is of two kinds, A Liberty in deed, when the Feoffee, donor etc. or in his absence his Attorney or procurator takes the Ring of Door, or Turf or twig of the Land, and delivers the same to the Feoffee, donee etc. in name of Seisin of the Land.

Warrant of attorney to make Libery - Hableadon, Seisin, or Seisin

A Liberty in Law called also a Liberty within bion, is when the Feoffee says to the Feoffor in view of the House or Land, I give you the Land to you and your heirs, therefore enter into the same and take possession thereof; And the Feoffor doth enter accordingly in the name of the Feoffee. This Liberty in Law can be made by an Attorney.
