Misfeasance - a Mistrial - Jurisdiction, or the plaintiff answers to the Defendant's Rejoinder

An use in behalf of another - Cestui que use (for cestui que use de qui) he for whose another man is, in feoffment in Lands or Tenements, and makes an estate according to his directions, letting him take the profits

Cestui que Trust - he who holds a Trust in Lands or Tenements committed to him for the benefit of another or one that stands in the use of another, who is called Trustee to an use

Turbary - Turbaria (from Turba an obsolete Latin word for a Turf - Common of turbary - common Turbaria is a liberty which Tenants have by prescription to dig to dig Turf on the Lord's waste

Guardian or Guardian - Guardian ship - a committee

Vacancy of a Benefice, when it is void of an Incumbent. Absence or Absence of a Benefice the expectation of it - a Benefice in absence, in expectation or incumbency

Let it be done or taken de bono esse - personable, in able to hold plea in court, standing tractus in curia

Exlent - Re Exlent

To Exlent - Lands worth so much per annum for 99 years all Repay for Tenant (if Tenant do from holding) Tenant in Fee - that holds of some Lord by Fealty, Feodary
